To stare – пристально вглядываться, уставиться на что-то

A walk in the park - прогулка в парке. (также идиома «ничто в сравнении с», т.е. очень легко по сравнению с чем-то другим)

E.g. High school is **a walk in the park** compared to university. – Средняя школа – «детские игры» в сравнении с университетом.

- a sailboat ride прогулка на парусной яхте
- a lover's vow клятва возлюбленного

to cling to something – цепляться, хвататься за что-то

heartache – душевная боль (*сравните*: chest pain - сердечная боль)

juke box - музыкальный автомат

to belong to someone – принадлежать кому-то

4. Party Invitations: useful phrases, conversation scripts and dialogues

Inviting a friend over to a party

Script 1

Do you have any plans for the 4th (fourth) of July? I would love it if you could come to my party. We are having our annual barbeque.

Script 2

We are having our annual 4th of July party. There'll be fireworks. I would love it if you could come. You are welcome to bring a guest.

Asking what to bring and giving suggestions

What can I bring? – Что принести?

Can I bring something? – Я могу что-то принести?

A bottle of wine would be great. – Вино было бы очень кстати.

Maybe, some soft drinks. – Может быть, безалкогольные напитки?

Bring your favorite dish if you have the time. There'll be plenty of food. – Принесите Ваше любимое блюдо, если будет время. Еды будет много.

A vegetarian dish would be perfect. – вегетарианское блюдо было бы в самый раз.

I think we have everything covered. – Похоже, я нас все есть.

Just bring yourself. – Главное, сами приходите!

We are having a pool party. Bring your bathing suit. – Мы устраиваем пикник у бассейна. Захватите купальник.

We'll have a beach party and a bonfire later. – Мы устраиваем пикник на пляже, а потом костер.

We are doing a bonfire on the beach. – Мы устраиваем костер на пляже.

Dialogue 3

- Do you have any plans for the 4th?
- I haven't decided yet.
- We are having a potluck. Come with your family.
- Thank you. What can I bring?
- A bottle of wine would be great.

Dialogue 4

- We are having a 4th of July picnic at the park. It'll be a family affair. There'll be lots of outdoor games for the kids. Would you like to come?
- Oh, the kids would love that! What time should we come?
- Come around five if you can.
- What should I bring?
- Bring your favorite dish if you have the time. There'll be plenty of food.

Dialogue 5
